






FACULTY CORNER

Pyopneumothorax Due to Proteus Mirabilis: A Rarely Encountered

Clinical Entity

Case Report:

A 45-year-old male patient came to Pulmonology OPD with c/o shortness of breath with greenish expectoration in the past 10 days & right pleuritic pain since 2 days. He has signs of severe protein energy malnutrition. Chest X-ray showed right sided loculated

pleural effusion. He returned to OPD with aggravated symptoms after 4 days. On auscultation, decreased breath sounds below clavicle anteriorly, below axilla laterally, in between scapula border and vertebrae were noted. On intercoastal drainage insertion it was diagnosed as pyopneumothorax. The aspirated thick Pleural fluid was sent to Department of Microbiology for culture and susceptibility testing. The patient was empirically started on parenteral antibiotics (Piperacillin-Tazobactam and Amikacin).

The Gram-stained smear showed numerous polymorphonuclear leukocytes with many pleomorphic Gram-negative bacilli. The culture yielded a growth of non-lactose fermenting colonies on MacConkey agarand swarming growth on Blood agar which is identified as Proteus mirabilis. The antibiotic susceptibility pattern showed sensitivity to empirically started antibiotics and the patient responded well to the treatment. Tube drainage and other supportive treatment were continued. The patient improved gradually and pleuritic pain subsided & the effusion resolved progressively.

Discussion: Pleural space infections due to Proteus species are infrequent. Pubmed database uncovered 49 previously documented cases of pleural space infection caused by Proteus species in adults. Of 29 cases documenting the specific species, P. mirabilis was found in 28 (96.5%) cases and P. vulgaris (3.4%) was found in one.

Conclusion:

Although it is rare, we should be cognizant of the possibility of Proteus species as a causative agent of pyopneumothorax, especially in patients with malnutrition, diabetes, and renal diseases. Reliable and accurate identification and speciation of culture-nositive isolates is nivotal for administering appropriate antibiotics and reassuring a convincing outcome.




A RARE CASE OF CYSTIC CHANGE IN PLEOMORPHIC ADENOMA


<u>Clinical history</u>: A 50 year Female presented with right cheek swelling for 3months <u>Local examination</u>: 3x2.5cms, soft, fluctuant swelling seen on right cheek. <u>Gross findings</u>: External surface - Near globular grey white cystic mass measuring 3x2.5x2.2cms.cut section shows a cyst filled with grey brown material.

<u>Microscopy</u>: Shows a cyst wall lined by pleomorphic adenoma showing glandular and stromal tissue along with myxoid areas and central cystic areas showing inflammatory cells and hemorrhagic material.

<u>Discussion</u>: Pleomorphic adenoma, the commonest tumour of major salivary gland usually presents as a solid swelling, but cystic change is a rare finding and a diagnostic challenge as it can mimic mucocele or mucoepidermoid carcinoma. In this case the lesion is presented in the minor salivary gland which is very rare in occurrence.
